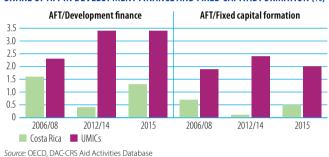

# SHARE OF AFT IN DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AND FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION (%)

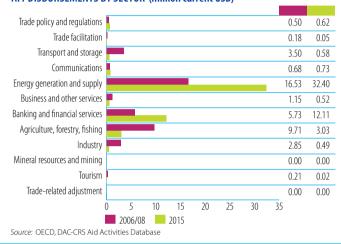

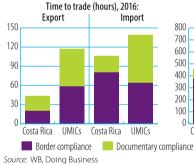
#### AFT DISBURSEMENTS BY SECTOR (million current USD)

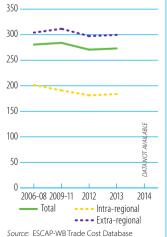


### TRADE COSTS (ad-valorem, %)

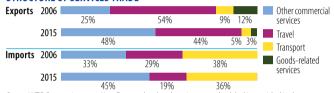

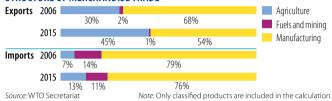

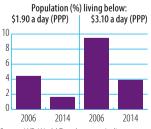

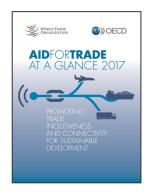
GDP PER CAPITA (constant 2011 international \$)
