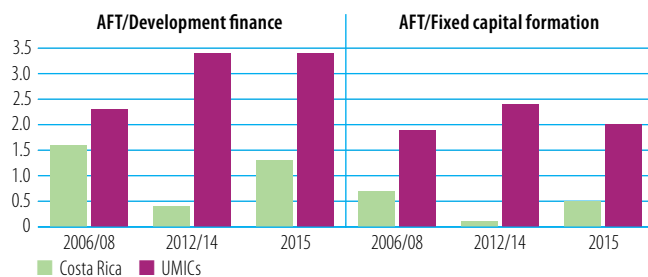

SHARE OF AFT IN DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AND FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION (%)



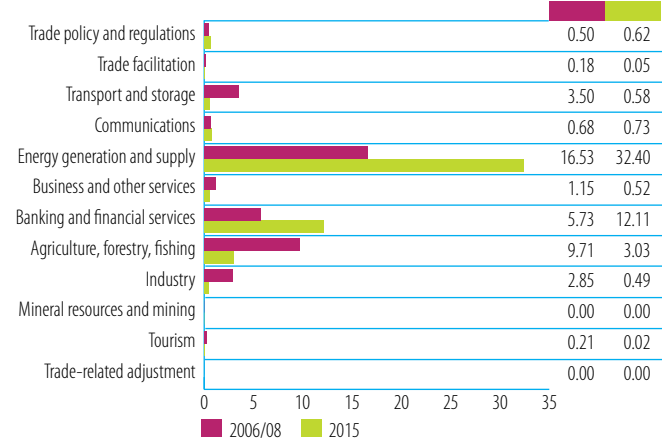

AFT DISBURSEMENTS BY SECTOR (million current USD)



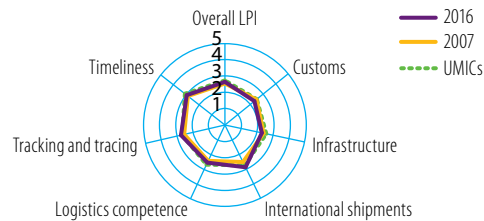

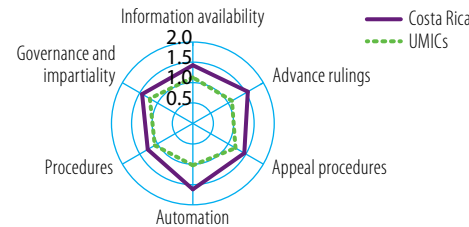

LOGISTICS PERFORMANCE INDICES (LPI) (1-5)



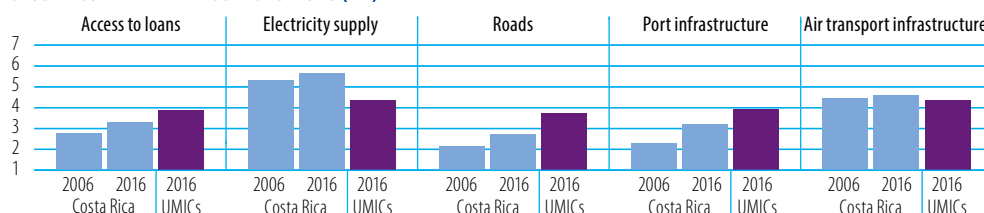

TRADE FACILITATION INDICATORS, 2017 (0-2)

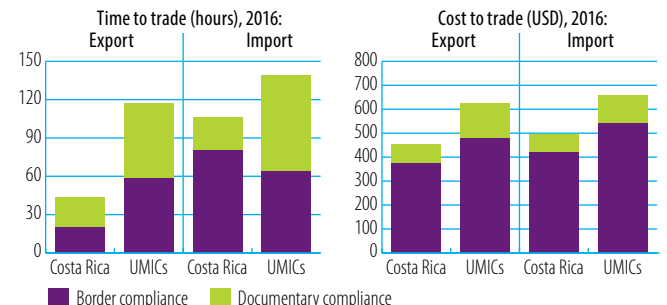

GLOBAL COMPETITIVENESS INDICATORS (1-7)

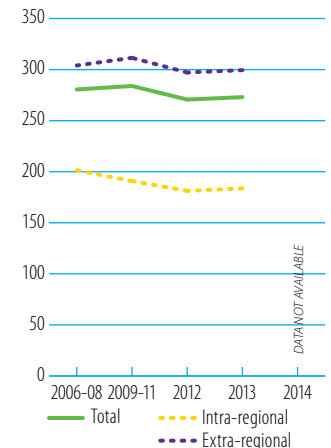

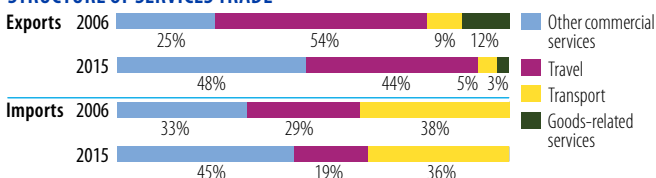

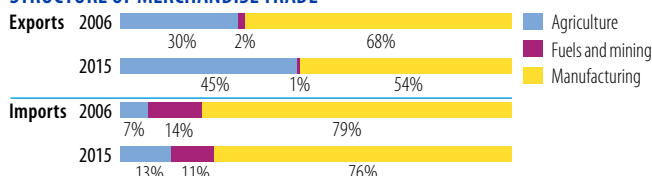

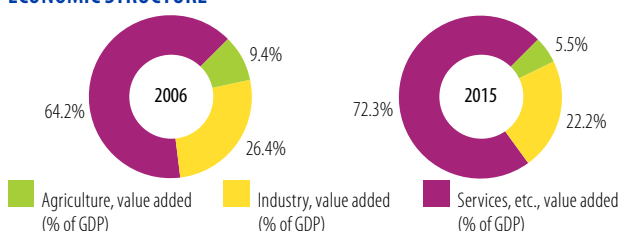

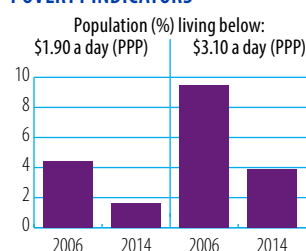

ECONOMIC STRUCTURE



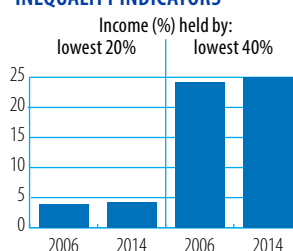

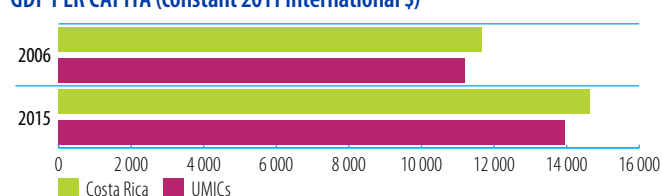

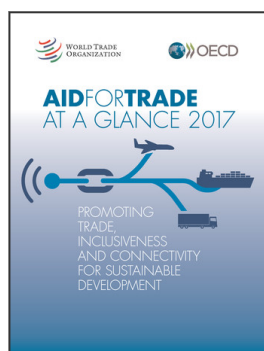
INEQUALITY INDICATORS
