

SHARE OF AFT IN DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AND FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION (%)




AFT DISBURSEMENTS BY SECTOR (million current USD)



TRADE FACILITATION INDICATORS, 2015 (0-2)



TRADE COSTS (ad-valorem, %)












