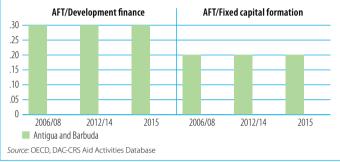

SHARE OF AFT IN DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AND FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION (%)

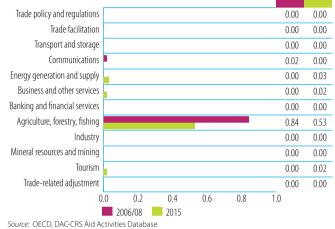

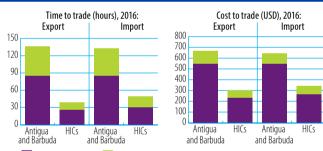

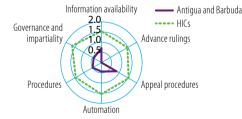

LOGISTICS PERFORMANCE INDICES (LPI) (1-5)



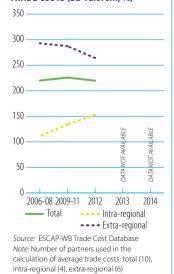
TRADE FACILITATION INDICATORS, 2017 (0-2)

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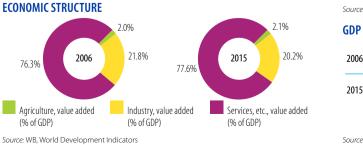

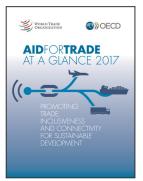


GDP PER CAPITA (constant 2011 international \$)
