





Aid-for-trade priorities remain unchanged.


Trade is not mainstreamed in the national development plan, but is addressed in the annual budget.






#### Trade Performance Index







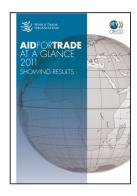
#### Share of main commodity group
