





#### BY SECTOR (Share in total AFT, commitments, 2009)




# **SHARE IN ODA** (Commitments, 2008-09 avg.) AFT share in sector allocable ODA compared to its region and income group shares





Aid-for-trade priorities are mainstreamed in the national development plan and operational strategies have been updated accordingly.







Imports by main origin (% share of total)






