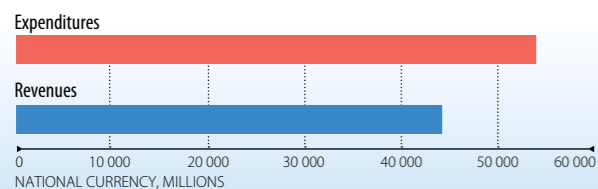

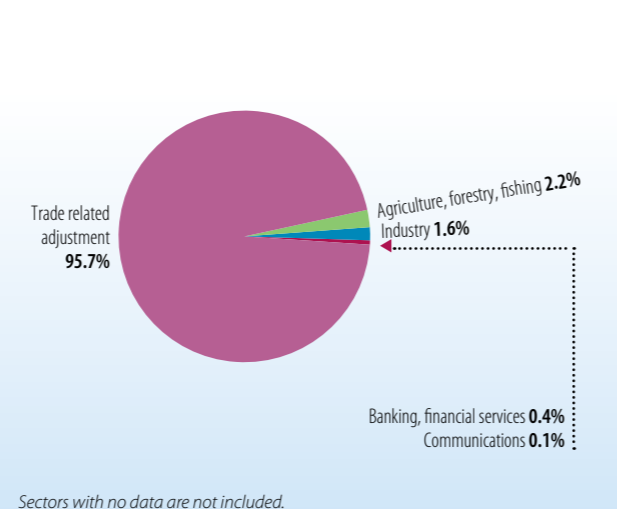

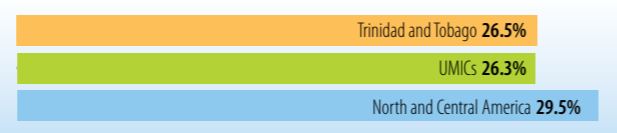

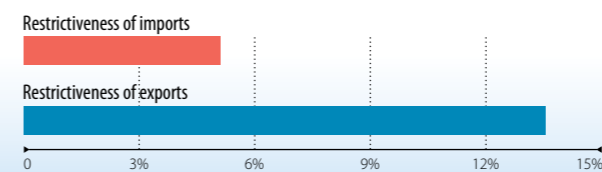

Changes to aid-for-trade priorities have not been mainstreamed in the national development plan. Not sure whether operational strategies have been updated accordingly.

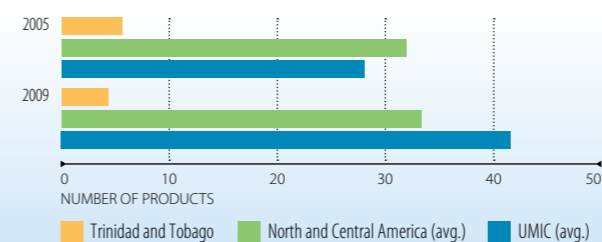

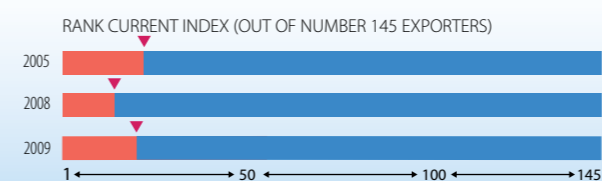

Product diversification (Number of equivalent products at SITC 3-digits)



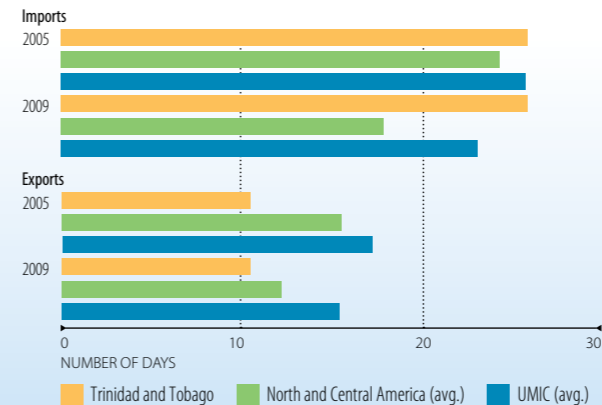

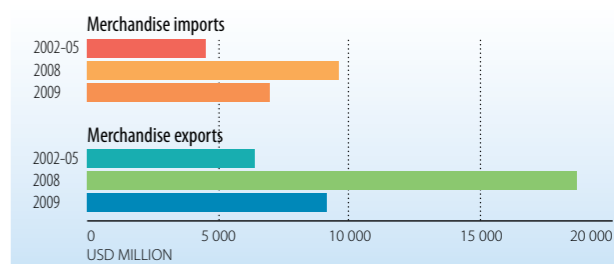
Number of days for trading across borders



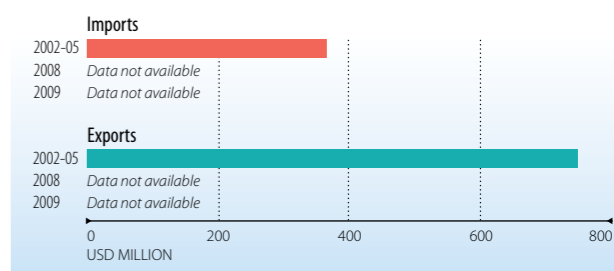

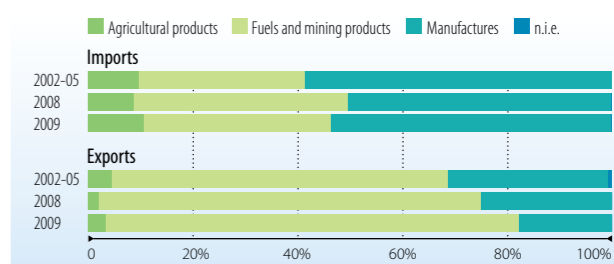

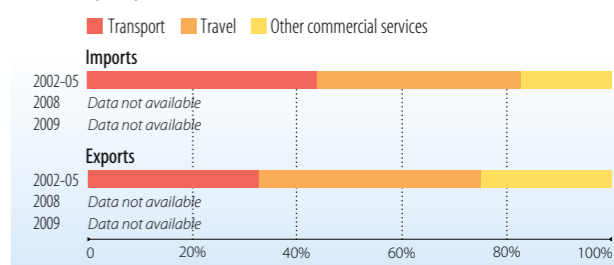

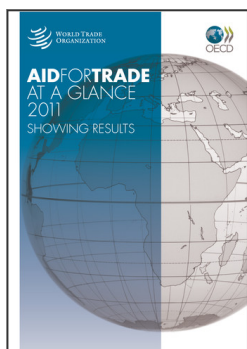
### TRADE COMPOSITION<sup>21</sup>
