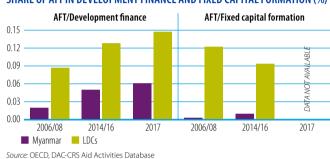

#### SHARE OF AFT IN DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AND FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION (%)

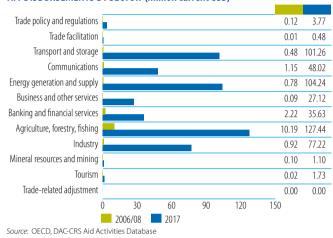

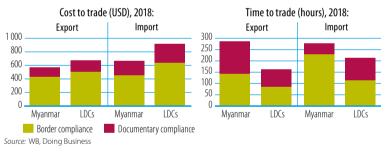
## LOGISTICS PERFORMANCE INDICES (LPI) (1-5)



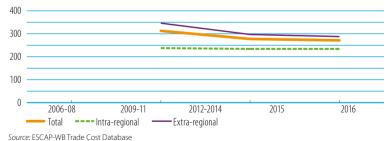

## TRADE COSTS (ad-valorem, %)



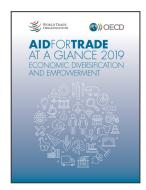
