1. Leaving aside the special case of Mexico City (the Federal District) that obtains 46% of its total revenue from own-sources.
 2. Although *Ramo 33* has 6 funds, only two of them –FAIS and FAFM– concern transfers to municipalities.
 3. The formula first calculates a poverty indicator defined as the squared weighted sum of five family poverty satisfactors: income, education, housing, sewage and electricity (called the global poverty index). These indicators are later added up to obtain municipal, state and national poverty indexes (Scott, 2004).

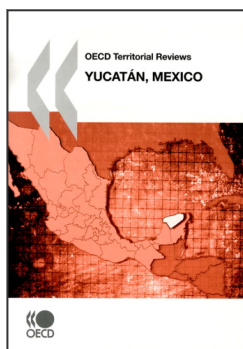
Figure 1.1 Income and Growth in OECD Regions.....	22
