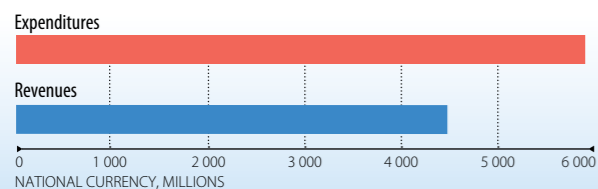

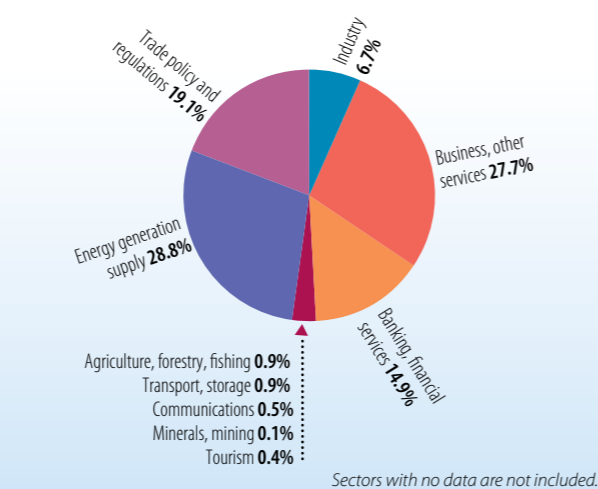

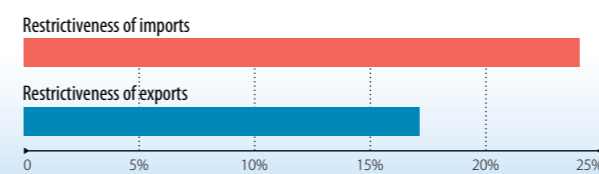

Aid-for-trade priorities remain unchanged.

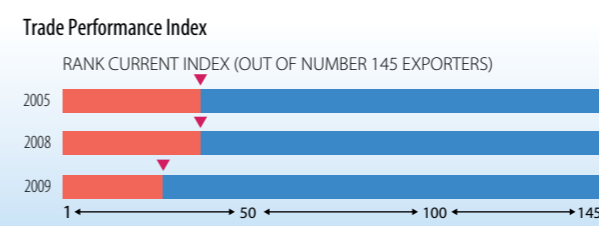

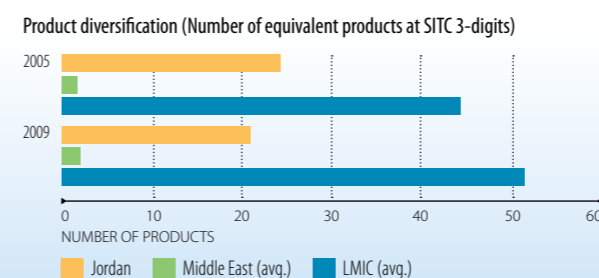

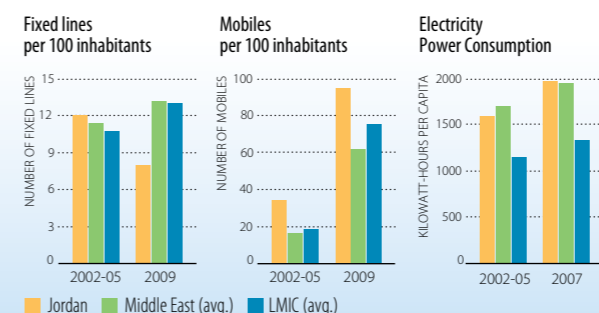
PRIORITY 1: COMPETITIVENESS¹⁶



PRIORITY 2: EXPORT DIVERSIFICATION¹⁷



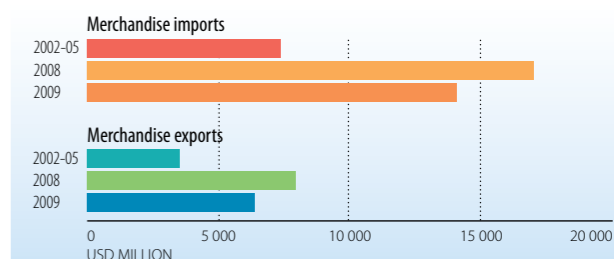

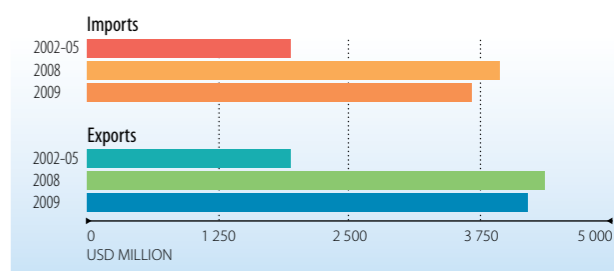

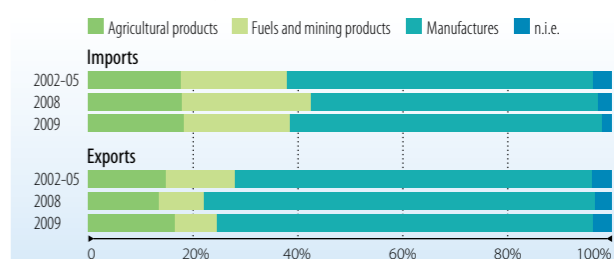

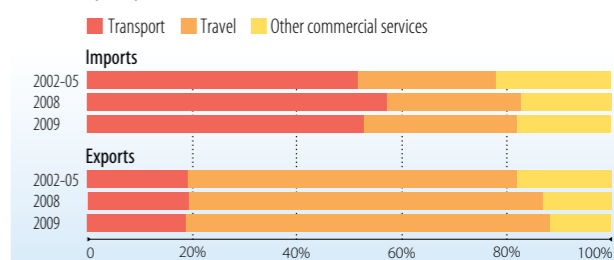

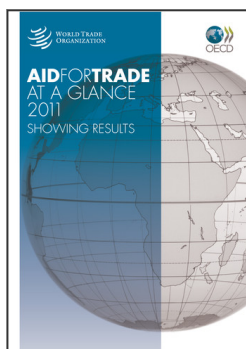
