38672 Copyright OECD 1986 The Government Household Transfer data base (GHT) consists of annual statistics on social security and welfare transfers to households from government, covering the period 1960-84. Social security benefits are classified by subfunction according to the Classification of the Functions of Government (COFOG). This report describes the contents of GHT, the sources used and the problems encountered in setting up the data base. Tables are presented showing levels expressed in U.S. dollars per head of population, transfers as a percent of GDP, the distribution by subfunction and elasticities of transfers with respect to GDP. Growth rates are given for the periods 1960-73, 1973-79, 1979-84 and 1960-84. The annexes contain country tables showing the subfunctional breakdown of transfers in national currencies and a description of the items included and the sources used.

La base de données des transferts des administrations publiques aux ménages (GHT) consiste en des statistiques annuelles des transferts relevant de la sécurité sociale et des oeuvres sociales pour la période 1960-1984. Les prestations et allocations des administrations publiques aux ménages sont ventileés selon la Classification des Fonctions des Administrations Publiques (CFAP). Ce document décrit le contenu du GHT, les sources utilisées et les problèmes que posait la constitution de cette base de données. Les tableaux montrent les transferts par tête exprimés en dollar E-U, les transferts en pourcentage du P.I.B, la ventilation par sous fonction et les élasticitiés des transferts par rapport au P.I.B. Des taux de croissance sont calculés pour les périodes 1960-73, 1973-79, 1979-84 et 1960-84. Les annexes contiennent les tableaux, par pays en monnaies nationales, des transferts par sous-fonction et une description des rubriques et sources.

THE GOVERNMENT HOUSEHOLD TRANSFER DATA BASE 1960 - 1984

Introduction

- 1. Since 1981 the Economic Statistics and National Accounts Division of Economics and Statistics Department has been building up a "Government Household Transfers" (GHT) data base containing statistics on social security and welfare transfers to households from government. The series in the file start around 1960 and are presently updated to 1983/84. The purpose of this Working Paper is to describe the contents of the file and to report on changes in the growth and composition of government transfers over the last two decades for the 20 OECD countries included in this file.
- 2. The next section explains how this data bank has been created and precisely what it contains. This is followed by various comparative tables and charts comparing the levels, growth and composition of social security and welfare transfers in 20 OECD countries. Annex I shows the basic statistics contained in the file in national currencies. It also gives the sources used and explains how the standard classification of transfers used in this paper has been applied to the various benefits paid out in each country.

Contents and coverage of the Government Household Transfers (GHT) data base

- The GHT data base was created with the aim of extending the main Government Expenditure data base which conforms with the standard definitions and classifications used in the national accounts. This latter file gives a breakdown of government expenditure by type of outlay, function and level of government but for many countries gives relatively limited detail on government transfers to households. In developing the GHT data base, priority was given to national accounts sources wherever these were available since it can be assumed that the underlying concepts of national accounts transfers are nearly - but not completely - standardized. For some countries it was necessary to supplement these data using other statistical sources. Many OECD countries include a detailed breakdown of transfers to households in their national accounts publications but it is not always clear whether a particular benefit relates exclusively to a particular function. Several government statistical offices were helpful in providing additional information to enable a more accurate allocation of payments to be made. Nevertheless, a number of problems remain, and the following points should be borne in mind when looking at the tables:
- (i) In the Japanese and German national accounts publications, transfers are allocated on an institutional basis rather than on a functional basis so that figures may under or overstate any particular function if they include payments for other functions than the main one.
- (ii) A common problem in using sources other than the national accounts is that sometimes no distinction is made between social security benefits and those paid under private schemes. This was a serious problem for the early Portuguese data. The high figures shown for pension payments and family benefits in France are partly due to the inclusion of private (i.e. non-compulsory) schemes; although government transfers represent about 96% of total transfers received by households.
- (iii) In Canada, sickness and maternity benefits are paid out of unemployment insurance and cannot be identified separately. The only benefit recorded under temporary sickness refers to industrial accidents of a temporary nature.

- (iv) In some countries transfers are understated due to the exclusion of benefits in-kind. According to the United Nations Classification of the Functions of Government (COFOG) (1) which is used for classifying government outlays, benefits in-kind should be included in social security and welfare transfers where appropriate. Countries for which benefits in-kind are not included in the transfers shown here are: Australia, New Zealand, Germany and the United Kingdom.
- 4. Government social security and welfare transfers to households may be broadly defined as compensation for loss of income or an inadequate earning capacity. They include payments in cash and in kind for sickness, maternity, industrial injury and other accidents, unemployment, and pensions for old age, survivors and permanent disability, family allowances, housing allowances and other social assistance to disadvantaged groups with special needs. Reimbursements for medical expenses such as doctors' fees, hospital fees and medicaments are not included.
- 5. In this paper social security and welfare transfers have been classified according to the following sub-functions as defined in the COFOG:
 - (i) Sickness, maternity or temporary disablement benefits.
 - (ii) Government employee pension schemes, old-age, disability or survivors' benefits.
 - (iii) Unemployment compensation benefits.
 - (iv) Family and child allowances and benefits.
 - (v) Other social security benefits.
 - (vi) Welfare.
- 6. The boundary between social security and welfare is not clearly defined in COFOG and the treatment of a similar benefit may well differ between countries. It was sometimes impossible to make the split between benefits for a short-term disability and those for a permanent disability in industrial injuries allowances.
- 7. It is important to emphasize that government transfers to households as defined here do not give a complete picture of the extent to which governments supplement the incomes of their citizens. For example, housing subsidies, tax relief for families, concessionary travel fares for certain groups are excluded although they obviously provide indirect benefits to households. The importance of these items varies from country to country and to some extent bias the comparisons; countries which pay rent allowance or high family allowances will be shown as having higher transfer payments than countries which achieve the same ends by providing subsidised accommodation or by giving tax relief for dependant children. In general, unemployment and pensions are least influenced by institutional differences of this kind.

Transfers in real terms expressed in US dollars

8. Tables 1 and 8-11 are described as being "at 1980 prices". Transfers cannot be broken down into price and quantity components and so they cannot be expressed at constant prices as can be done with commodity flows such as capital formation or consumption expenditure. For these tables the current price data contained in Annex 1 have been converted into "real terms" by deflation, using each country's implicit price deflator for private consumption expenditure. The underlying assumptions in the use of this

deflator are that the recipient households spend all the transfers they receive on the various goods and services that enter into private consumption expenditure and that their expenditure patterns coincide with the average for the nation as a whole. While neither assumption may be wholly correct - some transfers received will be used to purchase tangible or financial assets and households receiving transfers may have atypical expenditure patterns - the use of the private consumption deflator in this way is a widely-employed convention.

9. In order to allow inter-country comparisons the data in the tables have been converted to US dollars using the Purchasing Power Parities (PPPs) that have recently become available for OECD countries(2). PPPs may be described as those rates of exchange which equalize price levels between countries. When PPPs are used, it follows that if the dollar value of transfers are shown as identical in two countries, they represent the same command over goods and services in the two countries. When exchange rates are used this will only be true in exceptional circumstances. For these tables the PPP for private consumption has been used as currency convertor following the same reasoning behind the choice of deflator.

Levels and growth of government transfers to households

- 10. Government social security and welfare transfers to households have shown continuous real growth in all countries over the period 1960-84 both in absolute levels per head of population and as a percentage of GDP. This is illustrated in Charts A and B respectively. It is clear from Chart A that the growth and the level of transfers vary markedly between groups of countries. The high growth and high levels of the five countries shown in the top left-hand graph contrast sharply with the countries in the bottom right-hand graph. However, there has been a levelling off in nearly all countries in the last few years. Chart B shows that, generally, countries with a high level of government transfers spent a correspondingly higher proportion of GDP on transfers. Spain and Ireland were exceptions where, by 1983, transfers expressed as a percent of GDP were close to the OECD average although in real dollars per head they were among the lowest.
- 11. Table 1 shows total transfers in US dollars per head at 1980 prices converted from national currencies using the 1980 private consumption PPP. The countries having strongest growth over the period Japan, Portugal, Greece and Spain started from levels well below the OECD average, but even with high growth, transfers in Portugal and Spain reached only 30% and 60% respectively of the OECD average by 1984. At the other extreme, the Netherlands and Sweden maintained a high level of expenditure and fairly strong growth throughout the period.
- 12. Since 1973, the general pattern has been a slowing down of growth with this trend accelerating in some countries during the years 1979-84. The OECD average growth over the period 1979-84 was less than half that experienced over the years 1960-73. The only exceptions where growth continued at a high rate after 1979 were Greece and Ireland though several countries maintained high growth right up to 1979. There has been an actual decline in 1984 over the previous year in transfers paid per head of population in seven OECD countries, and in five other countries there was little or no rise.

- 13. Social security transfers expressed as a percentage of GDP (Table 2) have continued to rise in all countries over the whole period. By 1984 they were highest in the Netherlands, reaching 23% of GDP closely followed by France, Austria and Sweden, and lowest in Japan, where government transfers to households amounted to only 7% of GDP. Despite the slower growth in absolute amounts noted above, nearly all countries experienced higher growth in transfers as a share of GDP since 1973, and even since 1979 average growth equalled that for the 1960-73 period. Norway and Switzerland provide the main exceptions to this general trend. New Zealand is the only country where there has been a decline in social security and welfare transfers relative to GDP; this occurred between 1960-73.
- 14. Table 3 shows "elasticities" of transfers in relation to GDP. Expenditure on government social security and welfare transfers has been expanding faster than GDP in all countries since 1960. The highest rate for OECD average occurred over the period 1973-79, falling back to pre-1973 growth for the years 1979-84. On average, transfers have increased 33% more than GDP since 1960 the highest increases were in Switzerland, Japan and the Netherlands, and the lowest in Germany and New Zealand. Over the period 1973-79 the Japanese and Swiss figures were greater than 2.0, which means that transfers were growing more than twice as fast as GDP.
- 15. Tables 4 to 7 show the various kinds of benefits as shares in total government social security and welfare transfers. In Tables 8 to 11 the four main types of transfers in real US dollars are shown as per head of their target populations: pensions per head of persons aged 65 and over, unemployment benefits per head of average number unemployed, family allowances per head of children under 15, and temporary sickness benefits per head of persons in employment. Transfers are shown as a percent of GDP in tables 12 and 13: table 12 refers to old age, survivors, disabled and unemployed, and table 13 refers to all other social security and welfare transfers.
- 16. Table 4 shows that by far the largest share went on pensions and other benefits for old age, disability and survivors. The average OECD share remained stable throughout the whole period at around 68%, although expressed in real US dollars expenditure has continued to rise, reflecting the increase in the number of persons of pensionable age the main beneficiary of this type of expenditure. Table 8 shows that the level of benefits per person aged over 65 have tripled in real terms in all countries since 1960. Figures for Southern European countries, Ireland and United Kingdom are well below the OECD average. The inclusion of benefits paid from non-compulsory schemes partly explain the very high figures for France.
- 17. Table 5 shows that expenditure on unemployment benefits has been increasing since the mid-1970s, reflecting the sharp increase in unemployment since that period. Unemployment compensation benefits represent an increasing proportion of total transfers rising from around 5% in the 1960s to 12% in 1984 with considerable increases during the last 10 years in many OECD countries. Table 9 shows that there is no recognisable upward trend in benefits per unemployed. For several countries the abrupt changes from one year to the next suggest the introduction of new legislation concerning eligibility and amounts of benefits paid or possibly data problems. The unemployment figures used in the denominator in some cases refer to a single date in the year and in others they are the average of quarterly estimates. The high figures recorded for Canada are due to the inclusion of sickness and maternity benefits.

- 18. The increase in social security and welfare transfers as a percent of GDP is mainly accounted for by the increase in benefits paid to the old, handicapped and unemployed. Table 12 shows that transfers as a percent of GDP for this group rose on average from 4.5 percent in 1960 to 10.5 percent in 1984 while benefits to families, temporarily sick and other social security and welfare payments increased from 1.9 percent to only 2.8 percent of GDP (Table 13).
- 19. It is difficult to make intercountry comparisons for family transfers because of differences in the coverage of benefits and institutional differences such as varying reliance on housing subsidies and rent allowances, family allowances and tax relief. Family benefits in real US dollars declined in seven OECD countries after peaking around 1975-76. Among countries where family benefits continued to rise despite a falling-off of the numbers of children aged less than 15 were France, the United Kingdom, Switzerland, Norway and New Zealand. In Austria, the Netherlands and Sweden, expenditure rose until 1980 and in Denmark until 1982 before declining.
- 20. Table 10 shows family benefits in real terms per person aged less than 15 the main target group. No general pattern of growth emerges from this table. In 13 countries the level per person aged less than 15 continued to rise until 1983 or 1984 but in other countries the peak occurred in the 1970s. In 1984 benefits per person were very high in Austria, the Netherlands, Denmark and France (the data for France include allowances from non-compulsory schemes) and were very low in Greece, Spain and Portugal about 15% of the OECD average.
- 21. Temporary sickness transfers per person in employment (Table 11) are more likely to reflect differences in the coverage of sickness insurance than real differences in the amount of benefits paid to the sick. The denominator refers to all employed persons, including self-employed but in several OECD countries the self-employed and certain categories of employees are excluded from statutory insurance schemes. The very low figures shown for Canada refer only to compensation paid for short-term industrial injuries, as sickness and maternity benefits are included with unemployment insurance and cannot be separately identified. The big increase in 1982 in the figures for Finland is due to the introduction of a new sickness and maternity allowance system.
- 22. Over the whole period since 1960 there has been a definite increase in real benefits paid per head for sickness and maternity in all OECD countries except the United Kingdom, but since the late 1970s benefits have remained stable or decreased slightly in half of the countries.

US \$ PER HEAD



